**MATTER RECOMMENDED TO THE COUNCIL**

**1. ANNUAL REPORT 2008/09**

The Committee reviewed the Annual Report and Summary Report for the year ended 30 June 2009. A summary of proposed changes to the 2008-09 draft Annual Report that had been identified in the audit process was tabled.

**Recommended to the Council**

*That the Finance and Audit Committee recommends the adoption of the Annual report 2008/09 by Council.*

**Resolved by the Committee**

That the Finance and Audit Committee confirms the transfer of \$250,000 from the General Reserve to the Building Redevelopment Reserve.

**MATTERS RESOLVED BY THE COMMITTEE**

**2. UNIFORM ANNUAL GENERAL CHARGE CRITERIA**

The Committee considered a report that described criteria for determining the suitability of Council activities for funding by way of a Uniform Annual General Charge (UAGC). This issue had been raised at the Portfolios workshop held on 2 September 2009.

The Committee expressed support for the proposed criteria. It was agreed that the Council needed to have a philosophical debate about the level of a UAGC including the issues of fairness and equity.

It was noted that the UAGC needed to be considered with other Council processes including the June decision to further consult on the recovery of water management costs.

**Resolved**

That the Finance and Audit Committee:

1. receives the discussion paper;
2. adopts the suggested criteria for determining activities suitable for UAGC funding, and
3. notes that this matter will be given further consideration along with proposals for part water management cost recovery proposals, which will be considered during the 2009-10 Financial Year.

**3. EFFECT OF UNIFORM ANNUAL CHARGE AND OR UNIFORM ANNUAL GENERAL CHARGE ON FUNDING FOR REGIONAL PARKS**

Following the report on UAGC criteria the Committee were presented with figures for various funding scenarios for the funding of regional parks.

**Resolved**

That the Finance and Audit Committee:

1. receives the report on the effects of UAC and UAGC on funding for regional parks; and
2. that the subject of item 6 (Uniform Annual General Charge Criteria) and item 7 (the effects of UAC and UAGC on funding for regional parks) be referred to the Land Portfolio before being referred to the Council.

**4. CHANGE TO FUNDING STRUCTURE FOR BUILDING ACT 2004 FUNCTIONS**

The Committee received information that had been requested following the discussion at the Portfolios Workshop held on 2 September 2009 with regard to the funding of the Council's activities in relation to dams certification under the Building Act 2004.

That the Finance and Audit Committee notes the reasons for changes required to the funding structure of dam building consent application processing and compliance.

## PURPOSE

The purpose of this paper is to seek the Council's approval of those parts of Chapters 1 (Overview), 2 (Ngai Tahu and the management of natural resources) and 3 (Air quality) of the Proposed Canterbury Natural Resources Regional Plan (PNRRP) for which all submissions or appeals are disposed of. This approval enables the Council to fix its seal to those parts of the PNRRP and then make them operative, thereby giving effect to the Council's resolution of 25 March 2009 (see Appendix 1).

## BACKGROUND

The 25 March 2009 Council resolution effectively sought that parts of Chapters in 1, 2 and 3 are made operative before April 2010. It is understood that the purpose of this is to extinguish existing use rights under section 20A of the Resource Management Act 1991 (RMA) prior to this date. While the resolution anticipated that it would be necessary to make an application to the Environment Court to achieve this, a closer examination of the legislation indicates that this is not so.

Clause 17(2) of the First Schedule of the RMA provides for the Council to approve those parts of the PNRRP for which all submissions or appeals are disposed of. This approval is to be given effect to by the Council fixing its seal to the PNRRP. Once the Council has approved those parts of the PNRRP, it can then that make these operative through the process set out in Clause 20 of the First Schedule.

While Clause 17(2) was only amended as of 10 August 2005 to provide this power to a local authority, instead of the Environment Court, Section 131(8) of the Resource Management

Amendment Act 2005 provides for this change to apply retrospectively. Therefore, while Chapters 1, 2 and 3 were publicly notified prior to the Amendment Act, the Amendment Act has effect in relation to these chapters. As a consequence the power now lies with the Council, not the Court, to approve a plan to be made operative in part.

## **OPERATIVE IN PART**

The approach recommended to Council is for it to approve as much of Chapters 1, 2 and 3 as possible in order that these can be made operative. This provides the greatest plan administration benefit and is the most cost-effective for the Council.

When approving parts of Chapters 1, 2 and 3, the key consideration is whether each part is beyond challenge. This includes considering whether it is legally possible for any of the outstanding submissions or appeals on other parts of the chapter to result, either directly or indirectly, to result in a change to these parts to be made operative.

The outstanding appeal matters are summarised in Appendix 3. In the main these relate to: the definitions in Chapter 1; the appeals to Chapter 3 grouped under the headings of 'Priority of Activity', 'Agrichemical Spraying'; 'Outdoor burning in residential areas', and 'Variation 11 (Rangiora)'. Consent memoranda are before the Court in relation to the appeals grouped under the headings: definitions, priority of activity and agrichemical spraying.

Recently the appeal period for Variation 13 (Ashburton) closed. No appeals were received by Environment Canterbury or the Environment Court. Similarly, there are no appeals on Variation 12 (Kaiapoi).

The analysis set out in Appendix 4 shows that it is possible for the Council to approve to be made operative large parts of Chapter 1, all of Chapter 2, and many of the parts of Chapter 3. In particular, in relation to Chapter 3 the Council is able to approve parts, allow key elements of this chapter to be fully implemented. These parts include:

- the prohibited activities rules associated with the combustion of specified materials;
- all the small scale fuel burning device rules, including the prohibited activities;
- all the large scale fuel burning device rules;
- all the provisions relating to the winter-time outdoor burning in Christchurch;
- many of the specific outdoor burning rules, but not in paper, untreated wood and green-waste in residential areas;
- all of the industrial or trade premises and industrial and trade processes rules;
- all the intensive farming rules;
- all of the waste management process rules;
- Variation 12 (Kaiapoi) provisions; and
- Variation 13 (Ashburton) provisions.

## **MINOR AMENDMENTS**

Clause 16(2) of the First Schedule of the Resource Management Act 1991 provides Environment Canterbury with the power to amend, without formality, a proposed regional plan where such alteration is of minor effect, or to correct any minor errors. It is generally recognised that the test for "minor effect" is whether the amendment alters the meaning or intent of any provision or application. Similarly, the same test applies in relation to "minor errors".

Before approving Chapters 1, 2 and 3, it is desirable for the Council to make a number of minor amendments. These are set out in Appendix 5. The changes are generally editorial in nature correcting numbering, cross references, and formatting issues and can all be made as minor amendments under Clause 116 of the first schedule to the Act.

## **FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS**

Approving part of Chapters 1, 2 and 3 will result in costs associated with the operative process set out in Clause 20 of the First Schedule of the Resource Management Act 1991. These costs are standard costs of making plans operative, and are budgeted for and within budget.

## **VIEWS OF AFFECTED AND INTERESTED PARTIES**

Views of affected and interested parties were not sought in the preparation of this item.

### 8. OPTIONS FOR MAKING NRRP – AIR PROVISIONS OPERATIVE

Katherine Wilson (Senior Resource Management Planner) introduced this item to decide on the process Council will use to bring the provisions in the proposed Natural Resources Regional Plan (NRRP) Air Chapter to the stage where we can require activities operating as existing uses under s20A of the Resource Management Act 1991 (RMA), to comply.

- (a) To seek approval from the Environment Court to make part of the proposed NRRP Chapters 1-3 operative under Clause 17 of the First Schedule to the RMA (Option 3 in this report).***
- (b) That the timing of and provisions to be included in the application for approval, shall be determined by progress with appeals and the need for existing activities to comply with the rules for discharges to air by April 2010.***

**APPENDIX 2: CLAUSES 16, 17, 20 AND 20A OF THE FIRST SCHEDULE OF THE RESOURCE MANAGEMENT ACT 1991**

**[16 Amendment of proposed policy statement or plan**

- (1) A local authority shall make an amendment to its proposed policy statement or plan to give effect ~~[[to any direction in a national environmental standard or a national policy statement or]]~~ to any directions of the ~~[[Environment Court]]~~ ~~[[under section 292]].~~
- (2) A local authority may make an amendment, without further formality, to its proposed policy statement or plan to alter any information, where such an alteration is of minor effect, or may correct any minor errors.
- ~~[[3) A local authority must make an amendment, without further formality, to its policy statement or regional plan or district plan to give effect to a direction to include specific provisions under section 55.]] ]~~

**17 Final consideration of policy statements and plans other than regional coastal plans**

- (1) A local authority shall approve a proposed policy statement or plan (other than a regional coastal plan) once it has made amendments under clause 16 ~~[or variations under clause 16A]~~ (if any).
- ~~[(1A) However, a local authority may approve a proposed policy statement or plan (other than a regional coastal plan) in respect of which it has initiated a variation.]~~
- ~~[(1B) A variation to a proposed policy statement or plan approved under subclause (1A) must be treated as if it were a change to the policy statement or plan unless the variation has merged in and become part of the proposed policy statement or plan under clause 16B(1).]~~
- (2) A local authority may ... approve part of a policy statement or plan, if all submissions or appeals relating to that part have been disposed of.
- ~~[(3) Every approval under this clause shall be effected by affixing the seal of the local authority to the proposed policy statement or plan.]~~

**20 Operative date**

- ~~[(1) Subject to subclause (2), an approved policy statement or plan shall become an operative policy statement or plan on a date which is to be publicly notified.]~~
- ~~[(2) The local authority shall publicly notify the date on which the policy statement or plan becomes operative at least 5 working days before the date on which it becomes operative.]~~
- (3) Repealed.
- (4) The local authority shall provide one copy of its operative policy statement or plan without charge to—
- (a) The Minister for the Environment; and
  - (b) The appropriate regional manager for the Ministry for the Environment; and
  - (c) In the case of a regional coastal plan, the Minister of Conservation and the appropriate regional conservator for the Department of Conservation; and
  - (d) In the case of a district plan, the regional council and adjacent territorial authorities; and
  - (e) In the case of a policy statement or regional plan, constituent territorial authorities and adjacent regional councils; and
  - (f) The tangata whenua of the area, through iwi authorities ...; and
  - ~~[(g) the board of any foreshore and seabed reserve in the area.]~~
- (5) The local authority shall provide one copy of its operative policy statement or plan to every public library in its area.
- (6) The obligation imposed by subclause (5) is in addition to the local authority's obligations under section 35 (records).

**[20A Correction of operative policy statement or plan**

A local authority may amend, without further formality, an operative policy statement or plan to correct any minor errors.]
