

Summary Notes for Event 3- What Next? The Future of Funding.

The third networking event was held on 3 August 2017 at Te Hāpua, the Halswell Service Centre in Christchurch. The event was well attended with 52 people representing community based/Third Sector Organisations (TSO), government agencies and philanthropic organisations.

The topic for the day was "The future of funding" with the objective of providing participants the opportunity to learn, discuss and explore different funding models from government grants to social enterprise. in greater Christchurch Summary Notes for Event 3- What Next? The Future of Funding.

1. **Waterways Partnership**- Clive Appleton and Shelley Washington talked about Christchurch City Council's proposal for a new initiative for their Long Term Plan, a Community Water Partnership. This will be a joint CCC, Zone Committee, Community and Environment Canterbury programme to improve waterways incorporating behaviour change, education and awareness initiatives. One of the goals is to establish an environmental waterway fund, to help foster and empower citizens and community groups to get more involved in waterway projects in Christchurch and Banks Peninsula.

The aim of this workshop was to understand the current community initiatives being undertaken and then hear what new projects these groups might wish to undertake if a fund is established. If the Community Water Partnership proceeds, then this information will be used to develop the detail of how the environmental waterway fund will operate and assist Council staff in their engagement with community groups. 2. Social Enterprise Models and Approaches- Alex Hannant showed us that social enterprises can look like many different things. Some are trusts, others are companies, and many are charities and community organisations. Fundamentally, social enterprises are mission driven organisations that trade for a social or environmental purpose. They aim to earn a profit and reinvest some of it towards fulfilling that purpose. All over the world, more and more entrepreneurs and organisations are realising the opportunity to drive social and environmental change through sustainable business. Alex showed examples of Social Enterprises from across the world and right here at home.
