- 2. The King of the Surf Championship Safety Plan is to be complied with.
- 3. A jet ski with an authorised marshal is to be on the water in the vicinity of the race area ensuring the area delineated on the attached map is clear of non-authorised vessels and or persons at all times the race is being conducted.
- 4. Should any unauthorised vessel or person enter the course whilst racing is in progress, all craft are to return to the standard rules of navigation as prescribed by Maritime Rule 22 and 91, and Part 2 of the navigation safety bylaw 2016, all participants are to be fully briefed on the safety plan and requirement to comply with the Maritime rules 22 and 91 prior to commencing the race.
- 5. All competing vessels are to comply with part 20 Navigation Safety Bylaw 2016 (identification)
- 6. No Jet Ski or other vessel is to go within 75 metres of the New Brighton Pier unless proceeding at less than 5 Knots( 8 km per hour)
